

# Cuba

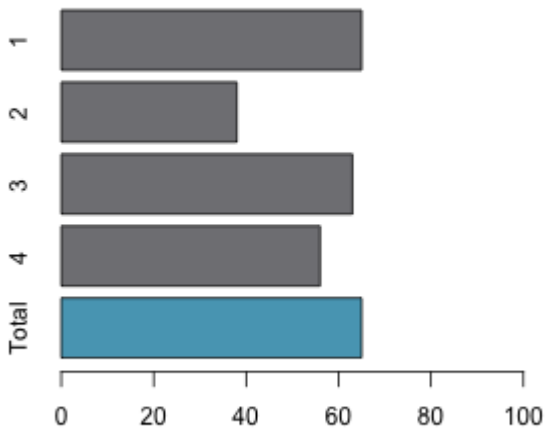

This score is a composite of the four domain scores discussed below.

The bar chart below shows Cuba’s total risk scores in 4 domains: (1) Business Interactions with Government, (2) Anti-Bribery Laws and Enforcement, (3) Government and Civil Service Transparency and (4) Capacity for Civil Society Oversight. The four domain scores are weighted and combined and a risk penalty is added for individual domain scores that exceed the overall country risk score. Each country is given a score from 1 to 100 for each domain, and for the total bribery risk. A higher score indicates a higher risk of business bribery.

1. **Business Interactions with Government:** Cuba scores 65 in this domain, based on a high degree of government interaction, moderate expectation of bribes, and a moderate regulatory burden.
2. **Anti-Bribery Laws and Enforcement:** Cuba scores 38 in this domain, based on a high quality of anti-bribery laws and a moderate quality of anti-bribery enforcement.
3. **Government and Civil Services Transparency:** Cuba scores 63 in this domain, based on moderate governmental transparency and moderate civil-service transparency/health.
4. **Capacity for Civil Society Oversight:** Cuba scores 56 in this domain, based on a low degree of media freedom/quality and a high degree of social development.
