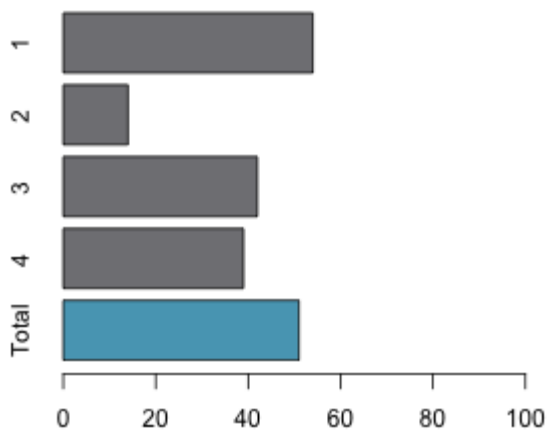

This score is a composite of the four domain scores discussed below.

The bar chart below shows South Africa’s total risk scores in 4 domains: (1) Business Interactions with Government, (2) Anti-Bribery Laws and Enforcement, (3) Government and Civil Service Transparency and (4) Capacity for Civil Society Oversight. The four domain scores are weighted and combined and a risk penalty is added for individual domain scores that exceed the overall country risk score. Each country is given a score from 1 to 100 for each domain, and for the total bribery risk. A higher score indicates a higher risk of business bribery.

- 1. Business Interactions with Government:** South Africa scores 54 in this domain, based on a low degree of government interaction, low expectation of bribes, and a moderate regulatory burden.
- 2. Anti-Bribery Laws and Enforcement:** South Africa scores 14 in this domain, based on a very high quality of anti-bribery laws and a high quality of anti-bribery enforcement.
- 3. Government and Civil Services Transparency:** South Africa scores 42 in this domain, based on good governmental transparency and moderate civil-service transparency/health.
- 4. Capacity for Civil Society Oversight:** South Africa scores 39 in this domain, based on a high degree of media freedom/quality and a moderate degree of social development.
